 States amounting to fifty cents being affixed thereto.

This deed made this 25th June in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty six between Richard
 Cadmus Barrott (grantor) of the first part and Wm. W. Briggs (trustee) of the other part Witnesseth: that the
 said R. C. Barrott doth hereby grant and convey to the said Wm. W. Briggs the following property, to wit:
 one pair of black horses, one chestnut-brown stallion, one mule (mule-bred), one bay mare, all the said
 Barrott's stock of cattle and oxen, together with their increase, all his stock of sheep, eighty or ninety in number,
 with their increase - one buggy and harness, one saddle and harness, all his farming utensils and implements
 including four carts and wheels - all his corn, feed, hay, and lucern now on hand - all his growing crops corn,
 fodder, clover, peas, potatoes &c. - one gold watch - all his household and kitchen furniture of every kind
 including five beds and furniture therewith - one saddle and bridle. On trust to secure the
 payment of the following debt, to wit, one bond due from the said R. C. Barrott to Benjamin C.
 Norrell for five hundred dollars due and dated June 16th 1866, bearing interest from date.

 Vick for and in consideration of the natural love and affection which he has for the said
 Mills H. Vick, Eliza J. Vick, Martha D. Vick, Sarah E. Ferguson & Eliza L. Ferguson
 and for the further consideration of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said Mills H.
 Vick, Eliza J. Vick, Martha D. Vick, Sarah E. Ferguson & Eliza L. Ferguson, doth
 grant with general warranty unto Mills H. Vick, Eliza J. Vick, Martha D. Vick,
 Sarah E. Ferguson & Eliza L. Ferguson the following property to wit, I give to
 my grand children Sarah E. Ferguson & Eliza L. Ferguson the sum of five dollars
 in money to each to him and their heirs forever. I give to my son Mills H. Vick
 the plantation known as the Vick Bryant place, to him and his heirs forever. I give
 unto my two daughters namely Eliza J. Vick & Martha D. Vick all of the balance
 of my estate both real & personal not before given away, consisting of land, mill (called
 the Bonnie mill) stock of all kind, crops of all kind, bacon, corn, fodder, household and
 kitchen furniture, money, bonds, & acct: due me, brandy, still, fixtures to them and their
 heirs, but in case either should die leaving no heir of their body, I give to the surviving
 one of the above Eliza J. Vick and Martha D. Vick but in case both should die leaving
 no heir of their body I give the said property to Mills H. Vick and his heirs forever
 against all persons do warrant and defend by their presents
