This Indenture made and entered into this 14th day of July A. D. eighteen hundred and sixty six between Augustus Crumpler and Virginia R. Crumpler his wife of the first part and Joseph B. Crumpler of the second part, all of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia, Witnesses, that for and in consideration of the sum of two thousand dollars in hand paid by the said Joseph B. Crumpler to the said Augustus Crumpler the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the said Augustus Crumpler and Virginia R. Crumpler his wife have bargained, sold and confirmed and by these presents doth bargain, sell and confirm unto the said Joseph B. Crumpler his heirs and assigns forever all of their right title and interest in & to one certain tract or parcel of land lying and being, situated in Southampton County, State of Virginia known as the Monroe tract and formerly owned by Edward Crumpler and sold to the said Augustus Crumpler and Joseph B. Crumpler by the said Edward Crumpler & Mahala Crumpler his wife, and estimated to contain five hundred and ninety five acres more or less and bounded somewhat as follows, Viz. On the north by the lands of Augustus Crumpler, on the East by the Stothaway River, and on the South and West by the lands of John W. Jenkins. To have and to hold the aforesaid tract or parcel of land and premises together with all the appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining thereto unto the aforesaid Jos. B. Crumpler, his heirs and assigns forever to & for the only proper use and behoof of the said Joseph B. Crumpler his heirs and assigns forever, and the said Augustus Crumpler and Virginia R. Crumpler his wife, for themselves, their heirs, executors, administrators & assigns, do and each of them doth, hereby contract & agree to and with the said Joseph B. Crumpler his heirs, executors administrators & assigns that they will by these presents forever warrant & defend all their right, title and interest in and of the aforesaid tract or parcel of land. In testimony whereof the said Augustus Crumpler and Virginia R. Crumpler his wife have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals this day and year first above written.
