This deed made this 13th day of April A.D. 1866 between Wm. H. Spratley Commissioner appointed by the County Court of Southampton, in the case of Miller agt. Miller's administrators to sell the real estate of which Nancy Miller died seized of the first part and James Scarborough of the County of Southampton of the second part. Witnesseth that the said Spratley Com. sold the lands of which Nancy Miller died seized to the highest bidder according to the terms of the decree above mentioned and James Scarborough became the purchaser at the sum of fifteen hundred and fifty dollars, which sum the purchaser has fully paid. Now this deed further witnesseth that in consideration of the premises, the said Spratley Com. as aforesaid doth grant unto the said Scarborough the tract of land in the bill and proceedings mentioned, of which Nancy Miller died seized, lying in the County of Southampton, adjoining the lands of F.
