This deed made this 27th day of July in the year of our Lord 1866 between James A Bell of the one part and James B Vick of the other part, Witnesses, that the said James A Bell doth grant unto the said James B Vick the following property, to wit, all of his growing crops of every kind for this year corn, fodder, peas, cotton, potatoes &c all his horses, hogs of all kinds, cows & cattle of every description, Wagons, Carts and gear and harness, ploughs & farming utensils of every kind and all and every species of property of every kind not heretofore conveyed. In trust to secure in the first place a debt due to James Holmes adm^r of James A Gillette dec^d for the rent of the place whereon Andrew reside and rented of him to become due on the first day of January 1867 for \$75.00 and in the second place to secure a debt due to Henry S Howard for about a hundred and fifty or sixty dollars - and to secure and save harmless from any loss or injury the said Henry S Howard as security on a forthcoming bond this day executed by me & with the said Henry S Howard as my security on an execution in the hands of James B. Vick one of the Constables in this County in favour of Dr. H. C. Darden for between fifty and sixty dollars - Witnesses the following signatures and Seals.
