horse-carts, one wagon, one ox-cart, one ethiope gun - the Carpenter's, Cooper's & Blacksmith's tools,
five hundred feet of timber (already cut) for plantation purposes, timber for twenty-five
barrels & for twenty kegs - thirty-two stacks of blade fodder, three hundred barrels of corn, ten
bushels of white peas, twenty bushels of blackpeas, six bales of cotton, eight barrels of brandy,
nine thousand pounds of bacon, eight kegs of lard, fourteen silver tea-spoons & twelve table-spoons;
three beds. As regards the mill property belonging to the estate, being unable to make a
division in kind, we would suggest that it be sold & the proceeds of the sale divided as required
by the will of Robt. Ridley dec'd.

six between Robert Ricks of the first part and James R. Ricks of the other part. Witnesseth, that the said
Robert Ricks for and in consideration of the sum of four thousand and eight hundred dollars (the receipt of
which sum to the said Robert by the said James is hereby acknowledged to be paid), doth bargain and sell,
grant and convey to the said James R. Ricks the following property, to wit, all that tract or parcel of
land on which the said Robert now resides, including therein the small tract known as the "Bee Land"
described to contain eight hundred and forty acres more or less, and bounded as follows: on the North
by Berry's bridge road and the land of Margaret Pounds and Mary Vick; on the East by the
Smithfield road, Consulton road and the lands of Dyer B. Vick and William G. Williams; on the
South by the lands formerly owned by Joseph Peeples and the land of Moses Cogner; and on the
West by the land of the said Moses Cogner and the land of George W. Vick; four head of horses,
twelve bayhorses "Bill" dark-bay horse Chanticleer; sorrel mare Rosy; and sorrel filly; nine head
of cattle including one work ox, twelve sheep together with the increase of the forementioned stock
of all kinds; all the carts, plows and farming tools and implements of every kind; and all the
household and kitchen furniture and utensils of every kind now on the said farm or premises -
