This Indenture made this 9th day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty six, between James W Battle of the County of Bedford State of North Carolina of the one part and Ann E Battle of the County of Southampton State of Virginia of the other part, witnesseth, that the said James W Battle for and in consideration of the sum of four hundred dollars doth grant, bargain and sell, unto the said Ann E. Battle her heirs and assigns forever, all of his right, title and interest, claim to, and in all the lands to which he has title lying and being in the State of Virginia, consisting of two thirds of a tract of land containing one hundred and sixty three acres, set apart to James Battle in the division of the lands of which his late father William R Battle deceased and possessed, in the County of Southampton, State of Virginia, which said two thirds is sold for one hundred and eight acres, being the same more or less. To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with all its appurtenances thereto belonging or in any way appertaining unto the said Ann E Battle her heirs and assigns forever.

This deed made this the 20th day of August One thousand eight hundred and sixty six, 1866, between Exum Bryant of the County of Southampton and State of Va of the one part and Henry T Bryant and James E Bryant of the County of Bedford and State of N Carolina of the other part, witnesseth, that the said Exum Bryant of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of twelve hundred dollars (\$1200) in hand paid by the said Henry T Bryant & James E Bryant the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, doth grant and convey unto Henry T Bryant and James E Bryant the tract or parcel of land on which he now resides containing three hundred acres more or less, and bounded as follows, by the lands of Henry Thaddeus Weston, Mahilda Worrell and by Sweet house pump, to them and their heirs forever. And the said Exum Bryant doth warrant generally the property hereby conveyed.
