cattle, sheep and hogs and their future increase, all of his present crops of corn, fodder, potatoes, peas &c  
all his household and kitchen furniture, carts and whals and all other farming implements, also the tract of land  
on which the said Wm B. Pope now lies, supposed to contain two hundred acres, to be the same more or less,  
and adjoining the lands of the estate of Thomas A. Knight dec'd. Mr. R. Howell, James Drury and  
Aaronson B. Pope. In trust to secure the following debts due Benj. C. Pope, Wm. B. Pope and Geo. C. Pope
