This Deed made this 8th day of October in the year eighteen hundred and sixty six, between James Gould of the one part and Mordacai H Bradshaw as trustee of the other part. Witnesseth, that the said James Gould doth grant unto the said Mordacai H Bradshaw the following property, the land of land wherein he now resides, containing Thirty five acres, bounded by the lands of Gethers Brumel & Elizabeth Ruxford, one horse, cattle and hogs, household & kitchen furniture. In trust to secure the bonds payable to Mordacai H Bradshaw executor of Mordacai Bradshaw due one for two hundred dollars the 12th day of August 1865 & twenty one dollars & twenty one cents 12th of August 1865 for money loaned. Given under our hands and Seals the day and date above written.

This Deed made this 7th day of October A.D. 1866, between Godwin Parker and Sarah A. Parker his wife of the one part and Willis W Lawrence of the other part, all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, Hinesville; that the said Godwin Parker and Sarah A. Parker in consideration of the sum of three hundred and fifty dollars and fourteen cents in Specie, have granted bargained & sold, and do hereby grant, bargain & sell unto the said Willis W Lawrence, a certain piece or parcel of land containing by estimation Seven acres more or less and bounded as follows, Viz: beginning at a maple a marked corner tree on the side of a small cut on the North side of Stoney River fifty feet from low water mark thence to an oak; thence keeping fifty feet from said oak bearing up to another oak; thence to a pine; thence to a cypress; thence to a black gum; thence to a sweet gum; thence keeping the said distance up the river to a small cypress; thence along a line of marked trees to a red oak near the river landing; thence along a line of marked trees to a red oak on the side of a hill; thence keeping the same distance to a post oak; thence bearing northeast to a small persimmon; thence through the old field to a persimmon a bottom; thence bearing West along a line of marked trees to a chinquapin standing on the side of said river, just below the Ferry; thence to the channel of the said river; thence down the river to the first station; it being the small piece or parcel of land which was conveyed by Polly Jones executors of Abingdon Jones due to Henry Gardner by Deed recorded in Southampton County Court on the 20th July 1848; to have and to hold the aforesaid piece or parcel of land with all the appendages and appurtenances in any way whatever belonging thereto -
