

This Deed made this the 20th day of October 1866 between William Cobb and Nathaniel Allman, Witnespskth, that in consideration of the sum of One thousand dollars the said William Cobb doth grant unto the said Nathaniel Allman the following property to-wit: all of his Stock, including horses, mules, cattle, hogs, sheep &c of his crop of all kinds and all of his household and kitchen furniture of every kind. And the said William Cobb doth covenant with the said Nathaniel Allman that he will warrant generally the property above conveyed. Witnespsk the following signature and seal.

In trust to secure the payment of the following debts due Willis W. Lawrence, to-wit, one note or bond for five hundred dollars due and dated June 5th 1859 and one other bond for one thousand dollars of even date with this deed.
