

This Deed of trust made this 6th day of November 1866 between James S. Williams debtor of the first part & W. M. Briggs Trustee of the second part. Witnesseth, that the said James S. Williams doth convey unto the said W. M. Briggs Trustee, the following property, to wit, One third of the growing crops of all kinds, consisting of corn fodder, six sheats, three sheep, two cows & wheels and farming utensils, one single barrel gun. In trust to secure the following debts, viz. One bond due Martha Jenkins the 5 day of April 1854 for ninety dollars, another bond due said Martha Jenkins the 10th day of March 1855 for forty dollars, one bond due James Griffin the 2^d March 1866 for one hundred & twenty dollars. This Deed made this sixth day of November in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty six, between Davis Barrett of the County of Southampton of the first part and George H. Darden, Trustee, of the second part. Witnesseth; that the said Davis Barrett for and in consideration of the premises herein after stated, doth grant and convey to the said George H. Darden the following property, to wit, all the right, title and interest of every kind whatsoever, whether in possession, remainder or reversion, in law or equity, which the said Davis Barrett may now have or may hereafter come to him by virtue of present deeds, titles or conveyances, in and to the tract of land on which the said Davis Barrett now resides and which is held by Mrs. Caroline B. Stephenson, widow of Amos Stephenson as her dower and to which said farm is commonly known as the Thomas place and all the contingent interest which the said Davis may have in the tract of land owned by Miss Sarah A. Stephenson devised to her by her father Amos Stephenson the first named tract supposed to contain four hundred and fifty acres more or less, and bounded by the lands of William Thomas, Parker D. Story & others, and the last named tract supposed to contain one hundred and seventy acres more or less and bounded by the lands of Geo. D. Aycock, Wm. Thomas & others. The said Davis's interest in the first named tract being one third of the same after the expiration of the dower. all the said Davis Barrett's stock of all kinds, to wit, four horses one mule, twelve head of cattle, twenty-five sheep, twenty-five outhogs, together with all increase of the said several kinds of stock, all his household and kitchen furniture of every kind, all his farming implements of every kind including one wagon, three carts and wheels &c. &c. meaning to include all the furniture and farming implements in his possession. In trust to secure and protect from all loss and damage, in the first place and before all others, all persons who may be bound in any manner as surety for the said Davis Barrett - to wit, James S. Darden, Richard Lewis Bryant, Amos S. Pope, John S. Kendrick, E. Calhoun Barrett, Amos B. Stephenson and all other persons who may be bound in any manner as surety whether herein mentioned by name or not. And in the second place, to secure the payment of all debts which may be due and owing to my person by the said Davis Barrett as principal debtor, to wit, Harrison S. Pope, Ben. C. Pope, James S. Darden, John S. Kendrick, and all others whether specially mentioned by name or not. But the said Davis Barrett reserves to him self all such privileges, indulgences and protections which may now or may hereafter be afforded by any State law, State or Federal, whether passed or enacted by the authority of the State or of the Federal government, or other law for the protection of debtors. And further the privilege of ordering the said trustee to make sale of the said property herein conveyed, the whole or any portion thereof, if he the said Davis Barrett should think proper to do so, at his discretion, at his dwelling, at any time earlier not-
