

This Indenture made this 1st day of May in the year of our Lord 1866, by and between Frederick W Carr of the County of Norfolk State of Virginia of the first part Littleton H White of the County and State aforesaid of the second part, witnesseth that the said Frederick W Carr for and in consideration of the sum of two thousand five hundred and fifty dollars to him in hand paid at and before the signing, sealing & delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath granted, given, bargained and sold, and by these presents doth grant, give, bargain and sell to the said Littleton H White his heirs and assigns forever one half of a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton State of Virginia and bounded by the lands of Elizabeth A Turner, Richard Harris, Benjamin E Pote and the heirs of John A Persons dec. containing Eight hundred acres more or less to have and to hold the said piece or parcel of land to the said Littleton H White his heirs and assigns forever, together with all the privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining. A more particular description of said land can be found by reference to the deed from David A Thomas to said Frederick W Carr dated day of 1861. This Deed made the 5th day of November in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and sixty six, between Martha J Pope of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part, and Nathaniel Jones of the same County and State of the other part, witnesseth that the said Martha J Pope for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred and twenty dollars, to her in hand paid by the said Nathaniel Jones, the receipt whereof she hereby acknowledges, hath granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents doth grant, bargain and sell unto him the said Nathaniel Jones his heirs and assigns forever, all her right, title interest and estate of, in and to the undivided tract or parcel of land of which her father Matthew Vick died seized and possessed; her share of which being one fifth part. The said tract or parcel of land lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and in the vicinity of Newcombs Dept. containing two hundred and twenty two acres, or thereabouts more or less, and bounded by the lands of Mary Story, John C. Burner and others. To have and to hold all the said right, title and interest and estate of her the said Martha J Pope in the above described tract or parcel of land, unto him the said Nathaniel Jones his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Martha J Pope for herself, her heirs executors and administrators doth hereby covenant and agree with the said Nathaniel Jones his heirs, executors, administrators that she will by these presents warrant and forever defend her said interest and right in the aforesaid tract or parcel of land against the claims or demands
