C. Waller, agreeably to the terms of said several orders, at or before the sealing & delivery of this Indenture, which he the said W^m Urquhart, commissioner, party of the first part doth hereby acknowledge, hath given, granted, bargained & sold, & by these presents doth give, grant, bargain & sell, unto the said B. C. Waller, his heirs & assigns, the grist-mill across the Angelica Creek & four acres more or less, of land thereto attached lying & being in the County of Southampton bounded by the lands of F. G. Ridley, W^m Jackson, it being the same formerly owned by Major Thos. Ridley; which said land was sold by the said W^m Urquhart, commissioner, at public auction as aforesaid under the power given him as aforesaid, to have & hold the said grist-mill & land attached, with the appurtenances thereto belonging, to the said B. C. Waller, his heirs & assigns forever. And the said W^m Urquhart, commissioner as aforesaid, the said grist-mill & land attached, against himself his heirs, & all other person or persons claiming of or to claim by through or under him, unto the said B.
