This Deed made this first day of December in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty six between Margaret P. Barrett of the first part and George H. Dardot (Trustee) of the second part, Witnesseth; that the said Margaret P. Barrett doth grant and convey to the said George H. Dardot the following property, to-wit: all the right, title and interest of every kind whatsoever in possession or reversion, in law or equity, which the said Margaret may have in and to the tract of land on which she now resides, it being the same which was formerly owned by her deceased husband Captain John Barrett supposed to contain three hundred acres more or less, and bounded by the lands of John R. Rochelle Henry White, the heirs of William L. Barrett, of William E. Myrick & others, all her crops of every kind, corn, fodder, peas and potatoes - all her stock of every kind, two horses, cattle (4 head) thirty five head of hogs, ten sheep together with the increase of the said several kinds of stock - all her farming implements, 2 Cart, plows &c. one buggy and harness - all her household and kitchen furniture, to-wit: 18 chairs, four beds and furniture, one side board, one bureau, one desk, three tables, two small dressing tables, one breakfast and contents, one sofa - all her cooking utensils. In trust to secure the payment of the following debts, to-wit: One bond for seven hundred and sixty two dollars and forty seven cents due to Richard L. Bryant of new date with this deed, but the consideration whereof was contracted and created prior to April 1st 1865 - one bond due to William H. Parker for about ninety dollars contracted in the year 1861 or '62 (the exact amount and date not remembered) - a debt due James Dardot for one hundred dollars due next Christmas, which is for his services the present year - two bonds of fifty dollars each due Rich. L. Bryant guardian for the minor children of Wm. L. Barrett deceased, with interest thereon and all other debts on bond, open account or otherwise in matter to whom due, which may be justly owing by the said Margaret P. Barrett as principal debtor, but not as surety, whether specially mentioned herein or not -
