Carnahan the grantees of the other part and children of the grantor, Witnesseth, that for and in consideration of natural love and affection and the further consideration of the sum of One dollar to grantor in hand paid, by the grantees, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the said James I. Carnahan doth give and grant, bargain and sell unto Mary I. Carnahan and James I. Carnahan, in equal shares, all his household and kitchen furniture, farming implements, one Cart and harness, one horse and twenty head of hogs and their future increase. To have and to hold the aforesaid property as joint tenants - and should either the said Mary I. Carnahan or James I. Carnahan die under age, unmarried and without lawful issue then the share of the deceased to the survivor. Should both die under age, unmarried and without lawful issue then the said property to revert back to the grantor James I. Carnahan and his lawful heirs - And the said grantor doth hereby warrant the title to the aforesaid property generally to the grantees - At Witness the following signatures and seal -
