Whereas John D Myrick and Marie C his wife by their deed of trust dated the 27<sup>th</sup> day of October  
1866, and duly recorded in Southampton County, did convey unto John R Kelly, the trustee herein named  
certain lands in said County, with power to the said trustee and direction, to proceed as rapidly as practicable,  
to make sale of and collect the aforesaid thereby conveyed; and he is expressly empowered to make of all or any  
parts of the property thus conveyed, at public or private sale and on such terms and conditions as he might  
deem best. And whereas in execution of said trust, the said John R Kelly trustee as aforesaid, pro-  
ceeded to advertise the sale of said lands by printed handbills and by advertisements published in the  
"Petersburg Index" and "of Norfolk Virginian", and did on monday the 17<sup>th</sup> day of December 1866, at  
Jerusalem in said County (being County Court day) sell at auction a tract of land of four hundred and  
eighty four acres by recent survey part of the lands thus conveyed, called the "Whitfield Land" and which  
was purchased by George H Fogg at the price of five dollars and fifteen cents per acre, making the sum  
of two thousand four hundred and ninety two and forty cents: And also on the same day sold as aforesaid  
seventy four acres, further part of said lands, adjoining the above piece and the Adams Branch which was also  
purchased by said Fogg at six dollars and forty five cents per acre, making four hundred and ninety two  
dollars and ten cents, which last named piece can be more readily seen by reference to the plat attached to the  
said this day made by the R Kelly and Hader Biggs Trustees to Harrison P Pope. the sale made for our  
fourth cash, and balance on twelve months credit with interest from date and secured by a lien on the lands..

This Deed therefore made this 17<sup>th</sup> day of December 1866, between the said John R Kelly trustee as  
aforesaid, of the one part, and the said George H Fogg of the other part, witnesseth: That the said party  
of the first part in consideration of the sum of Twenty-four hundred and ninety two dollars and forty cents, and  
of four hundred and ninety two dollars and ten cents, doth grant with special warranty unto the said party of the second  
part, and to his heirs and assigns forever the said four hundred and eighty four acres, as appears by survey and plat  
herein annexed; and the said seventy four acres, as above referred to, the said parcels joining each other.
