Myrick, thence along William & Myricks line N 35° W 4° poles to a red oak, thence S 30° W 10° poles to a fence, thence N 24° W 22° poles to a dead post oak, thence N 23° W 31° poles to a fence, thence N 21° W 3° 9 poles to a dead post, thence N 51° W 51° poles to a fence, thence N 37° W 11° poles to a fence, thence along John S. Mongers line N 69° W 11° poles to the beginning.

Whereas John D. Myrick and his wife by their deed of trust dated the 27 day of October 1866 and duly recorded in Southampton County, did convey John R Kelly, the trustee thereon named certain lands in said County, with power to the said trustee, and direction to proceed as rapidly as practicable to make sale of and collect the rents thereby conveyed: and he is expressly empowered to make such sale by selling all or any part of the property thus conveyed at public or private sale and on such terms and conditions as he might deem best: - and whereas in execution of said trust by the said John R Kelly, trustee as aforesaid proceeded to advertise the sale of said lands by printed handbills and by advertisements published in the "Petersburg Advertiser" and "Daily Virginian": and did on Monday the 17th day of December 1866 at Jerusalem in said County, (being County Court day) sell at auction a tract of land (part of the lands thus conveyed) called the Barnes tract and containing two hundred and fifty five acres more or less adjoining the lands of Garrison P Pope and others, and which was conveyed by John W Barnes & wife Richard Porter & also to Thomas Swanson by deed dated 29th January 1838 and duly recorded & which was given by the will of said Swanson to the said John D Myrick: for particular boundaries of said land reference is had to said last named deed: and at such public sale the said tract of land was purchased by Garrison P Pope for the sum (in gold) of Eight hundred and fifty five dollars: This Deed therefore made this 17th day of December 1866, between the said John R Kelly as trustee as aforesaid of the one part and the said Garrison P Pope of the other part, witnesseth: that the said party of the first part, in consideration of the sum of Eight hundred and fifty five dollars aforesaid, doth grant unto the said Garrison P Pope and to his heirs and assigns the said tract of land and its appurtenances sold as aforesaid.
