

Part of the boundaries of the land of John D. Myrick laid off adjoining his mill. Beginning at a white oak at the dam, near the South end, thence along a new line at 67 $\frac{1}{2}$ poles to a pine thence at 15 $\frac{1}{2}$ & 31 poles to the run of the Mill swamp, a new corner in Martha Stephenson's line, thence from the white oak at the first station, along the Mill dam, nearly a North course 85 poles to the end of the dam, thence on high water mark nearly the same course 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ poles to Abner H. Stephenson's line, thence along his line 86 $\frac{1}{2}$ & 3 poles to a pine on the Mill path, thence same course 86 $\frac{1}{2}$ 69 poles a sweet gum, a corner for said A. H. Stephenson in Martha Stephenson's line; the balance not surveyed. The dotted line south of the above plat represents the line between Abner H. Stephenson and Martha Stephenson, if her line continues a straight course from the sweet gum to the run of the Mill swamp as represented by the black line, there is 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ acres land in the boundaries - 16 $\frac{1}{2}$ acres of which on the South side of the run of the swamp

Kelly before a Justice of the Peace admitted to record, Stamps of the internal revenue of the United States of the amount of One dollar and fifty cents being affixed thereto.

Whereas Richard H. Holleman did on the 6th day of April 1866 by his certain deed of Trust made and executed to the undersigned as trustee to secure to Timothy C. Holman the payment of certain debts in said trust deed named, convey among other property in said deed named all his right and interest in and to a certain Mill and fixtures known as "Portlow's Mill" being situate in the County of Southampton. And whereas the undersigned, the trustee, in the said deed as aforesaid being required so to do, and by and with the consent of the said Holleman and Holman did, after having in all things complied with the terms of said deed, on the 22nd day of October 1866 in front of the door of the Courthouse of Curry County by public auction made sale of the right and interest of said Richard H. Holleman in and to said mill and fixtures known as "Portlow's Mill" in the County of Southampton, at which sale Robert H. Proctor being the highest bidder became the purchaser thereof at the price of five dollars and twenty five cents. And therefore this deed made this 22nd day of October 1866 between William P. Underwood trustee & as approved of the one part and Robert H. Proctor of the second part both of the County of Curry in the State of Virginia, Witnesseth: that in consideration of said sum of five dollars and twenty five cents cash to him paid, he the said William P. Underwood trustee doth grant with special warranty to said Robert H. Proctor, all the right title and interest of Richard H. Holleman in and to the mill and fixtures known as "Portlow's Mill" being situate in the County of Southampton.
