

Part of the boundaries of the land of John D. Myrick laid off adjoining his mill. Beginning at a white oak at the dam, near the South end, thence along a line N 65° E 100 poles to a pine, thence S 15° E 31 poles to the rear of the Mill-pump, a new corner in Martha Stephensons line; thence from the white oak at the first station along the Mill-lane, nearly a straight course 85 poles to the end of the dam, thence on high-water-mark nearly the same course 125 poles to Abner H. Stephensons line, thence along his line S 65° E 3 poles to a pine on the Mill-path, thence same course S 65° E 9 poles a short gun, a corner for said A. H. Stephenson in Martha Stephensons line, the balance not Surveyed. The dotted line North of the above plot represents the line between Abner H. Stephenson and Martha Stephenson if her line continues a straight course from the short gun to the rear of the mill-pump as represented by the black line, there is 2 1/2 acres land in the boundary - 16 1/2 acres of which on the South side of the rear of the swamp.

Whereas Richard H. Holloman did on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of April 1866 by his certain deed of Trust made and executed to the undersigned as trustee to leave to Timothy & Almon the payment of certain debts in said trust deed named, convey among other property in said deed named all his right and interest in and to a certain Mill and fixtures known as "Problows Mill" being situated in the County of Southampton. And whereas the undersigned, the trustee, in the said deed so aforesaid being required to do, and by and with the consent of the said Holloman and others, did, after having in all things complied with the terms of said deed, on the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of October 1866 in front of the door of the Courthouse of Surry County by public auction made sale of the right and interest of said Richard H. Holloman in and to said mill and fixtures known as "Problow's Mill" in the County of Southampton, at which sale Robert H. Trotter being the highest bidder became the purchaser thereof at the price of five dollars and twenty five cents. Now therefore this deed made this 22<sup>nd</sup> day of October 1866 between William P. Underwood trustee & as aforesaid of the one part and Robert H. Trotter of the second part both of the County of Surry in the State of Virginia, WITNESSETH: That in consideration of said sum of five dollars and twenty five cents cash to him paid he the said William P. Underwood trustee doth grant with special warranty to said Robert H. Trotter, all the right title and interest of Richard H. Holloman in and to the mill and fixtures as known as "Problow's Mill" being situated in the County of Southampton.
