This Deed made this 17<sup>th</sup> day of December, on thousand eight hundred and Sixty six, between James J. Darden of the County of Southampton of the one part and Leroy R. Kelly chosen as trustee, for the purpose herein of the other part, witnesseth, that the said James J. Darden does grant with general warranty unto the said Leroy R. Kelly trustee as aforesaid the following real estate, to wit, a tract of land in the County of Southampton containing One hundred and forty eight & a quarter acres, including the dwelling and stowhouse at Stevens Dept. Being the same property this day purchased of John R. Kelly and Co: Biggs trustees for John A. Myrick (less 106 acres sold by said Darden to Harrison P. Pepe) On trust to be given to John R. Kelly trustee for John A. Myrick the sum of thirty one hundred and forty three dollars & fifty two cents further interest from the date of this Deed till paid being the defered payment on the purchase of the said real estate, and which is evidenced by a bond signed by the said James J. Darden and dated this day, payable twelve months after date with interest from date - with power to the said Leroy R. Kelly, trustee as aforesaid to execute this deed as the law directs. Whereas John A. Myrick and Marie E. Myrick by their Deed of trust dated the 26<sup>th</sup> day of May 1866, and recorded in the County of Southampton did convey unto Hader Biggs as trustee for Walter Myrick, among other estate, the tract of land in Southampton County called and known as the "poplar field" and which is herein after particularly described: And whereas also, the said John A. Myrick and Marie E. his wife by another Deed of trust dated the 27<sup>th</sup> day of October 1866, and duly recorded in Southampton County, did convey unto John R. Kelly, the trustee therein named among other property, the place occupied by John P. Pepe, in said County and which is the said "poplar field" farm and is a part of the twenty three hundred acres referred to in said last named Deed. And whereas by the last named Deed it is provided that the said John R. Kelly, trustee as aforesaid shall proceed as rapidly as practicable to make sale of and collect the aforesaid thereby conveyed, and he is expressly empowered to make sale of all or any part of the property thus conveyed, at public or private sale, as he may deem best, and on such terms and conditions as he might deem best; And whereas in execution of said trusts the said John R. Kelly and Hader Biggs, trustees as aforesaid, did proceed to advertise by handbills and by advertisements published in the "Pittsburg Index" and "Norfolk Virginian" and did on Monday the 17<sup>th</sup>
