

Kelly trustee as aforesaid and the said Hader Biggs trustee as aforesaid, of the one part & the said John Popel of the other part, witnesseth, that the parties of the first part, in consideration of the sum of five thousand five hundred & twenty five dollars and fifty cents, do grant with special warranty unto the said John Popel and to his heirs and assigns forever, the land aforesaid known as the "Poplar field" farm, containing by recent survey seven hundred and ninety six and a half acres, and which Survey is made a part of this deed.
