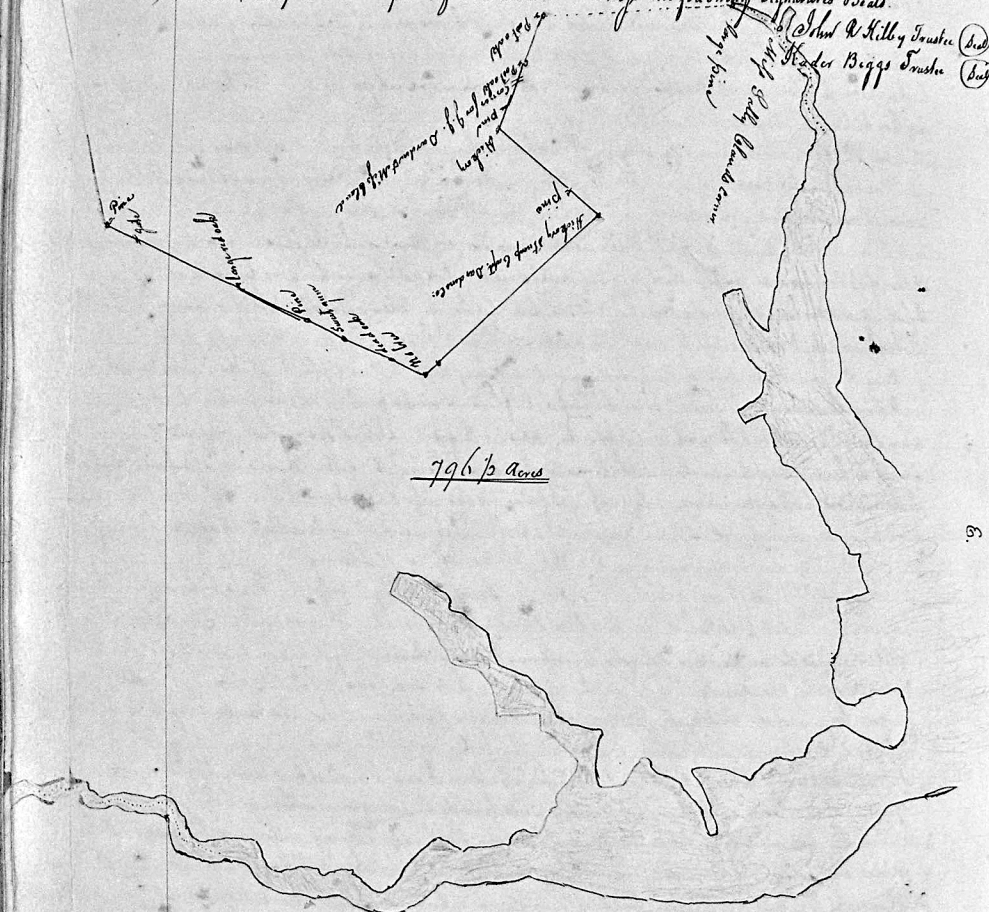

At Auction in Southampton County (being County Court day) sold at public auction the land referred to, one fourth for cash and the balance on twelve months credit with interest from date, to be secured by a lien on the land, and at such sale John Popel became the purchaser of said land which contains by recent survey seven hundred and ninety six acres and a half, at the price of seven dollars per acre, amounting to the sum of Five thousand five hundred and twenty five dollars and fifty cents. And therefore this Deed made this 17th day of December 1866, between the said John Popel of the one part, Witnesseth, that the parties of the first part, of the one part & the said John Popel of the other part, do grant with special warranty unto the said John Popel and to his heirs and assigns forever, the land aforesaid known as the "Poplar field" farm, containing by recent survey seven hundred and ninety six acres and a half, and which survey is made a part of this deed.
