

Roads at 63 $\frac{1}{2}$ & 29 poles to a hickory, a corner for Spradley Ispus huts, in Amos Popes line, thence along his line S 42° E 8 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles to a cherry tree, his corner, thence along the general course of the line of marked trees of Amos & Elisha Popes at 44 $\frac{1}{2}$ & 235 poles to a red oak (blow down), a corner for Samuel D. Darden in Amos Popes line; thence along said Dardens line of marked trees S 13 $\frac{1}{4}$ E 126 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles to a spruce; thence S 67° E 119 poles to his corner, thence at 45° E 98 poles to a hickory stump; thence at 51° W 55 poles to a hickory; thence at 20 $\frac{1}{2}$ E 50 $\frac{1}{2}$ poles to a Post oak, a corner of Miss Sally Glauco line; thence along her line of marked trees at 86 & 88 poles to a large pine, near a small brook or drain; thence down the run of the same to the run of a large branch, her corner. thence down the run of the branch to high-water mark on the Mill Pond; thence on high-water mark to the swamp first mentioned and up the same as far as high-water mark extends; thence up the run to the beginning. This Deed made this 17th day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six between John Pope of the County of Southampton of the one part, and Leroy R. Kilby chosen as trustee for the purpose herein of the other part, Witnesseth, that the said John Pope does grant with general warranty unto the said Leroy R. Kilby trustee as aforesaid, the following real estate, to wit: a tract of land in the County of Southampton containing five hundred & sixty five acres and a half, being part only of the tract of 1796 $\frac{1}{2}$ acres, this day purchased of John W. Kilby and H. Biggs, trustees of John D. Myrick, & called the "poplar tract", and on which the said John Pope now resides & adjoins Harrison J. Pope, Amos & Pope & Jas. J. Darden. In trust to secure to John W. Kilby, trustee for John D. Myrick the sum of thirty one hundred & thirty six dollars & twenty two cents with interest from the date of this deed till paid, being the deferred payment on the purchase of the said real estate, and which is witnessed by a bond signed by the said John Pope and dated this day, payable twelve months after date with interest from date, in the power to the said Leroy R. Kilby trustee as aforesaid, to execute this Deed as the law directs. Witness the following Signature Seal:
