An Indenture made and entered into this the 19th day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty seven (1867) between Wm. H. Pustlor Commissioner of the one part and William Atkinson of the other part, both of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia; Whereas, at the February Term of the County Court of Southampton County 1867, in the case of Oliver Binford vs. Binford & Co. it was decreed among other things, that upon payment of the bond to William Atkinson and John Pustlor of \$1215.50 to Wm. H. Pustlor Commissioner as aforesaid, that the said Commissioner was to execute to William Atkinson a deed with special warranty for the real estate in the proceedings mentioned of which Oliver Binford died seized and possessed, and the same having this day been paid to the said Commissioner by the said William Atkinson. Now therefore this deed Witnesseth, that the said William H. Pustlor Commissioner as aforesaid for and in consideration of the premises, and for the sum of one dollar in hand paid to him by the said Wm. Atkinson, doth grant and convey to William Atkinson with special warranty, that tract of land of which Oliver Binford died seized and possessed, said to contain two hundred and eighty seven acres more or less and bounded by the lands of Jacob Wade, John Lewis and the County lands known as the "Door-hous" South. On the North by said Atkinson's Mill-pond, on the West by the run of gravelly run and John Camps lands and on the East by Stony branch run, and the said William Atkinson's land.
