



This plot represents the tract of land Harrison Pope purchased of John Pope - Bounded as follows Beginning at the intersection of the Chappel Road and Mill Swamp, a corner for Eliak Pope his heirs, thence thence thence along the road 112 poles to a new corner between Harrison Pope and John Pope; thence along a new line between them N 48 $\frac{1}{2}$ E 33 $\frac{1}{4}$ poles to a small sweet gum; thence 57 $\frac{1}{2}$ E 96 poles to a poplar standing in a small branch; thence down the run of the branch to the Indian Swamp; thence down the run of the Swamp to high water mark on mill pond; thence on high water mark to the mill Swamp; thence on high water mark up the mill Swamp as far as it extends, thence up the run of the Swamp to the beginning) - Containing 234 acres - July 16. 1867

This Deed made the 14th day of February in the year 1867 between John W. Chase of the first part and William J. Holt of the second part, trustee, Witneseth: that the said John W. Chase doth grant unto the said William J. Holt the following property. One double case silver watch, one gold revolver, one double gun, one buggy harness, one bay horse, (Rasler) Crop of Corn, fodder, shucks, Potatoes, Peas, Beans, Cotton, one bond against J. D. Prince executed on or about January the 27th 1867 and due January 27th 1868. also one executed by Mrs. Ann E. Nease and due July 1st 1867 amounting to One hundred and twenty five dollars - One trust to secure to Joseph D. Smith & John G. Weeks as securities - for the payment of a bond executed to John D. Prince for three hundred and forty five dollars, bearing interest from date and due the 1st of July 1867. also to secure Joseph D. Smith as security to a note executed to Robert Scarborough due the 1st day of October 1867, for fifty dollars; also to secure to J. G. Weeks a note executed to him on or about the 27th of January 1867, for One hundred and forty five dollars and bearing interest from date; also to secure to secure to the said John G. Weeks as security to a note executed to Cecil Vaughan bearing interest from date for fifty dollars. The above being the first class debt. Barbados Turner
