This Deed made this 1st day of October 1866, between Edith E. Gillette of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia of the one part, and John H. Bishop of the same County and State of the other part, Witnesseth: the said Edith E. Gillette for and in consideration of the sum of One thousand nine hundred & eleven 75/100 Dollars paid to her late husband (Major Ed. E. Gillette) in his lifetime, by the said John H. Bishop, and also for the sum of four dollars then in hand paid by the said John H. Bishop, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged: She the said Edith E. Gillette hath granted, bargained and sold to and by these presents doth grant, bargain and sell unto him the said John H. Bishop his heirs and assigns forever, all the lands drawn by her in the division of the lands of her Father Lewis Worrell dec^d containing 27 1/4 acres, as will appear by the Commissioners report on the division of the lands of the said Lewis Worrell dec^d dated about the end of the year 1856, including what was then called the 2 Blor Tracts, the Edwards tract and the Newson & Wams tract of lands. The said tracts of land at that time being bounded by the lands of Davis Barrott, Amos Stephenson, Drury Beale, Henry Blor, Glen Rockwell, William Vick & others. To have and to hold the above described tracts or parcels of land and their appurtenances thereto belonging unto him the said John H. Bishop his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Edith E. Gillette for herself her heirs, executors and administrators doth hereby covenant and agree to and with the said John H. Bishop his heirs, executors and assigns that she will by these presents warrant and forever defend all the right and title of the aforesaid tracts or parcels of land against the claims or demands of all and every other person or persons whatsoever. In Witness whereof the said Edith E. Gillette hath hereunto set her hand and affixed her seal the day and year first above written.
