This Deed therefore made this 15th day of March 1867, between the said J. de Bordenave of the one part and Sam^t T. Drury chosen as trustee of the second part, Witneseth, that the said J. de Bordenave doth grant unto the said Sam^t T. Drury Trustee as aforesaid, two hundred bushels of wheat to be taken out of the present growing crop, when gathered; and the crop of corn which may be raised and grown during the present year by the said de Bordenave or others for him. In trust to secure to Rauls & Dillard the debt aforesaid due them and all interest due and to become due and to Rauls, Dillard \$6⁰⁰ the said sum due them and all interest as aforesaid, and also any debt due or that may be created by said de Bordenave with them for goods, wares and merchandise, during the current year as above set forth with power to the said Sam^t T. Drury Trustee as aforesaid to execute this trust according to law. Witness the following signature of the

This Deed made this 27th of November 1866, between E. W. Maplesburg Trustee of William Murfie & Commissioner & Receiver of the Circuit Court of Southampton, Joshua Proctor & Anna E. Proctor his wife of the first part and Frank M. Holland of the second part, Witneseth, that whereas the said William Murfie did by deed dated 1st day of May 1858 convey to E. W. Maplesburg along with other property certain house and lot situated at Franklin Depot in the County of Southampton bounded by the lands of John McAffe and Richard Barrett, the said lot containing by estimation the quantity of land embraced by a pointed yard wide on the main Road and running back 325 yards to the same more or less (it being the same conveyed to said William Murfie by deed dated the 28th day of February 1856 from A. W. Stauffer) in trust to secure certain debts therein mentioned: And whereas a suit was afterwards instituted by A. W. Stauffer against the said Murfie & others in the Circuit Court of the County of Southampton to subject all of the said property to the payment of a certain debt, in which suit a general order was made at the Term 18th directing the said E. W. Maplesburg as receiver & Commissioner of the said Court to sell the said property and distribute the proceeds as therein directed: And whereas the said E. W. Maplesburg did in pursuance of the said decree sell the said house and lot on the 18th day of November 1866 to Joshua Proctor, and whereas the said Joshua Proctor has never paid for the same or received any deed or title to or for the same but has recently sold the same to the said Frank M. Holland so far as he holds my interest therein with the agreement that he the said Holland shall pay to the said E. W. Maplesburg the purchase money due thereon. Now then know all men, that in consideration of the premises and for the further consideration of \$1800 to be paid by the party of the second part to the parties of the first part, the said E. W. Maplesburg Trustee, Commissioner and receiver as aforesaid, Joshua Proctor and his wife do grant unto the said Frank Holland all that house lot of land at Franklin Depot in the County of Southampton described as aforesigned to have and to hold to him and his heirs
