This deed of bargain & sale from Richard J. Darden & wife, James J. Darden Wife & James H. Pison & wife to Josiah Daugherty was acknowledged by the said Richard J. Darden to be his act and deed and together with the certificate thereto annexed of the acknowledgment of James J. Darden & James H. Pison and of the privity examination and acknowledgment of their wives admitted to record, a Stamp of the internal revenue of the United States of the amount of fifty cents being affixed thereto.

In Trust to secure a debt due from said Fulgence de Bordenave by bond of four hundred and eighty dollars and thirty one cents, to Francis W. Hillman. It is moreover directed that the said Joseph H. Holland trustee shall make no sale of the aforesaid property until the fifteenth day of December eighteen hundred and sixty seven without the consent of said Fulgence de Bordenave, but with such consent the said trustee may before that time, and without such consent may, at any time after that date sell the property hereby conveyed in any manner he may deem best for the interest of all parties. Delivered to G. W. Rayford Feb 21 1867
This deed made this the 22^d day of November in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and sixty six between Richard W. Clayton on the one part and Philip Rayford on the other, Witnesseth; that in consideration of seven hundred and forty eight dollars, that the said Richard W. Clayton doth grant unto the said Philip Rayford that portion of land cut off from Jones tract and bounded as follows; One the North by Round hill Swamp, on the West and South West by Willorn Hedgepeth and on the East by the remainder of Richard W. Clayton's lands, said piece estimated to contain one hundred and fifty one acres, two roods and sixteen perch, more or less - and said Richard W. Clayton defends the right and title of said piece of land except one half acre used as family burying ground - Witness the following signatures and Seal -
