This Deed made this seventh day of March eighteen hundred and sixty seven between Fulgence deBordenave of the one part and Joseph H. Holland citizen as trustee of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Fulgence deBordenave doth grant with general warranty unto the said Joseph H. Holland trustee as aforesaid the following property to wit. One top buggy and harness bought of A. Winn Starfield V^e. One brown mare bought of Edward F. Murfie, Southampton Co. Va. and one bay horse bought of Joseph Duke of Isle of Wight Co. Va. On trust to secure a debt due from said Fulgence deBordenave by bond of four hundred and eighteen dollars and thirty one cents to Francis W. Holland. It is moreover directed that the said Joseph H. Holland trustee shall make no sale of the aforesaid property until the fifteenth day of December eighteen hundred and sixty seven without the consent of said Fulgence deBordenave, but with such consent the said trustee may before that time, and without such consent may, at any time after that date sell the property hereby conveyed in any manner he may deem best for the interest of all parties. This deed made this the 22nd day of November in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and sixty six between Richard W. Clayton on the one part and Philip Raiford on the other. Witnesseth that in consideration of Seven hundred and forty eight dollars, that the said Richard W. Clayton doth grant unto the said Philip Raiford that portion of land cut off from Jones tract and bounded as follows; on the North by Round hill swamp, on the West and South West by Willow Hedge bush and on the East by the remainder of Richard W. Clayton's lands. Said piece estimated to contain one hundred and fifty one acres, two rods and sixtieth perch, more or less - and said Richard W.
