Bradshaw of said parish and County of the other part, Witness that they the said Mary Taper, Millie Taper, Martha Taper and Franklin Taper, for and in Consideration of the sum of Sixty seven dollars to them in hand paid as and before the ensaing and delivery of this present, the receipt whereof the said Mary Taper, Millie Taper, Martha Taper and Franklin Taper, doth hereby acknowledge and fully acquit and discharge the said William J. Bradshaw, his heirs executors and administrators of these presents. We the said Mary Taper, Millie Taper, Martha Taper and Franklin Taper, have granted, bargained, and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said William J. Bradshaw and to his heirs or assigns forever, One Certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the parish and County aforesaid, called and known as the Blighty tract, or a part thereof, containing by estimation 31 acres to the same more or less, and is bounded as following, beginning at a Pine tree near the orchard from thence a straight line of marked trees to the swamp, between said tract and Shugars Lains, down said swamp to a branch thence up the branch to a corner, thence a straight line to the beginning, with the ways, watercourses, profits, commodities, hereditaments, and appurtenances whatsoever to the said plantation tract or parcel of Land, belonging or in any wise appertaining, and the reversion and reversions, remainders, or remainders, rents profits thereof, and of every part and parcel thereof, and all the rights, title, interest, or claim whatsoever of them the said Mary Taper, Millie Taper, Martha Taper, and Franklin Taper or their heirs.
