One certain tract or parcel of land, Situate lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and Parish of St. Luke's, Containing by estimation One hundred and forty acres, more or less, and bounded as follows; Beginning at the first road at the line that I purchased of Ben. Rundell, going nearly North until it joins the tract which I bought of Dr. Bartham, then almost east until it strikes Samuel Ferguson's land, and then a South course until it reaches Ben. R. Griffon's line, at the new road, then a straight line until arriving at the first corner, allotted to. And I the said Miles Worrell, for myself my heirs Executors and Administrators, do hereby covenant and agree with my said son, Delaware T. Worrell above named, his heirs, Executors, Administrators or assigns, that I will by these presents warrant and for ever defend, all the right and title of the above described tract or parcel of land, against the claims or demands of all and every other person or persons whatsoever. More or less, and bounded as follows; Beginning on the Chappel road at Elbert Ferguson's corner, running down the road to the head of the branch, adjoining the land of Ben. Worrell and Samuel Ferguson, following which line, until arriving at the Battie Rundell tract, following which and Elbert Ferguson's line until arriving at the corner previously spoken of.
