This Indenture Made this the 14th day of October in the year one thousand eight hundred and Sixty Seven, between Lucy Allmond of the first part, and Nathaniel Allmond of the second part, all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia. Witnesseth, that for the Consideration hereafter mentioned, the Said Lucy Allmond bargains, sells and conveys to the said Nathaniel Allmond the following property, to wit, the tract of Land on which she at present resides and on which she has been residing for several years past, containing Two hundred Seventy four $\frac{1}{3}$ acres more or less, with all the personal property of every kind being and servants on the said land, as well as the crops of every kind made, or that will be made this year on the said tract of land; and for and in consideration of the foregoing, the said Nathaniel Allmond agrees and hereby binds himself to take care of and support the said Lucy Allmond on the said plantation, during her natural life, furnishing her with wholesome food, clothing &c. The said Nathaniel Allmond having advanced to the said Lucy Allmond the sum of Two hundred and fifty four $\frac{55}{100}$ dollars, it is hereby agreed between the parties aforesaid, that they should hereafter agree to receive the Contract and Sale aforesaid, which can only be done by their mutual consent, the said Nathaniel Allmond is to retain the property hereinbefore conveyed as security for the said sum of Two hundred and fifty four $\frac{55}{100}$ dollars advanced as aforesaid.
