

This Due Made this fifteenth day of November in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty seven, between Goodman E. Johnson of the first part and Gustavus Adolphus Johnson and Kenneth R. Johnson of the other part, all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia. Witnesseth: That the Said Goodman E. Johnson, for and in Consideration of the sum of One hundred and Ninety Seven dollars, by the Said Adolphus and Kenneth to the Said Goodman this day paid, the receipt of which Said Sum is hereby acknowledged, doth grant and Convey to the Said Gustavus A. Johnson and Kenneth R. Johnson the following property to wit: all that tract or parcel of Land on which the Said Goodman E. Johnson now resides, Supposed to contain One hundred and forty three acres, more or less, and bounded by the Lands of Lawrence Gardner, Willis W. Lawrence, and others, in the Said County of Southampton; the two horses now in possession of the Said Goodman, four Cows, and four yearlings, fourteen head of Sheep, all the Crops now gathered or standing or remaining in the field, on the Said farm, or tract of Land, to wit: Corn, fodder, Cotton, Peas, and Potatoes, all of the Said Goodman's hogs, say twenty eight in number, all of his farming implements of every kind, to wit, one Cow and wheels, plows and gear, two acres, horses &c.
