Westbrooke, the said is hereby acknowledged, That the said Thos. H. Westbrooke have this day granted bargained and sold to him The said W^m B. Westbrooke, The following property to wit, 1st The tract of Land now in the possession of the said Thos. H. Westbrooke and now residing on by him, & being the same purchased from the said W^m B. Westbrooke & known as the farmer's residence of Lees, Moore, containing Four Hundred & fifty acres, (be it more or less) and adjoining the County of Rockland Below and also of some of the said W^m B. Westbrooke, all in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia. 2nd The following Chattels to wit, 5 Head of Horned Cattle, Six Sows and pigs, 20 Sheds, Thirty Barrels corn, Three Thousand pounds black fodder, Five feather bedstead furniture, Six Chairs, 2 ploughs & gear, 1 Cart & wheel, 1 ox Cart & 20 do Cart & 2 wheel trees, One double barrel Gun. To have and to hold said property free from the claim of him the said Thos. H. Westbrooke & all and every person or persons whatsoever with general warranty Given under our hands & Seals the day and date above written.

This Deed Made the 21st day of November in the year 1867, between Richard Williams and Winifred his wife, of the one part and Harris Turner of the other part, all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, Witnesseth That in consideration of the Sum of One Dollar in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the said Richard Williams and Winifred his wife do grant unto the said Harris Turner a certain portion and parcel of my Land. Beginning at the past that comes from the road near to Larry Doyle's, then down the said road to round hill branch, then up said Round hill branch to the old line that originally divided my lands and A. B. Wignacourt's, then turn up the said Old line which is now the line between me and Walter Cott, to a marked pine tree and also tree that stands by the side of the path, then down the path by my new ground through the middle of the land between my fenced and Harris Turner's to the road to the beginning.
