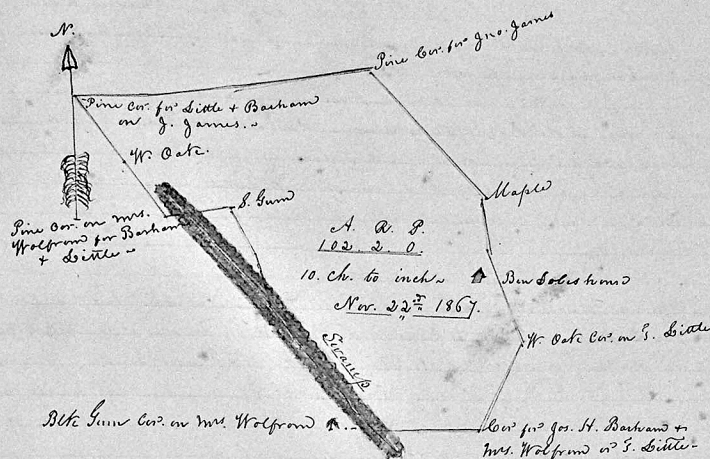

The above is a plot of the Land Survey, Nov. 22^d 1867, for S. G. Little and Jos. H. Backham sold by the former to latter and contains 102¹/₂ Acres, bounded as follows. Beginning at a Pine corner for J. G. Little and S. H. Backham on J. James thence a line of Maple trees to a Pine corner for J. James on Jos. H. Backham, thence S. 39¹/₂° E. 31.90 ch. to a Maple thence S. 3¹/₂° E. 5.80 ch. to a S. Gum, thence S. 18¹/₂° E. 30 ch. to a W. Oak Cor. on S. G. Little thence S. 30° W. 11.00 ch. to a Cor. for Joseph H. Backham and Mrs. Wolford on S. G. Little thence N. 88° W. 10.80 ch. to a Blk Gum Cor. for Mrs. Wolford thence along the flat Swamp a line of Maple trees to a pine corner on Mrs. Wolford for Backham and Little, thence N. 41° W. 7.00 ch. to W. O. thence N. 33° W. 12.00 ch. to Pine at beginning.

This Deed Made this 31st day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and Sixty Seven between Joseph J. Johnson Executor of the first part and Charles E. Bryant's Executor of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Johnson doth hereby grant and convey unto the said Bryant the following property, to wit: All my right in the Land which I now live, (which is my wife's life interest) and Bureaus & cooking glass, three tables, six chairs, one bed and gear, two feather beds & furniture, and spinning wheel, all my cooking utensils, nine Hogs, together with their increase, all of my crop of corn, fodder, peas, cotton and potatoes, plows, gear, house &c. in trust, to secure the payment of the following debt, to wit: One Bond due to Richard L. Bryant for the sum of Sixteen dollars bearing date December 29th 1866. One other Bond due to Richard L. Bryant, bearing date August 15th 1867 for the sum of Two hundred and Ninety one dollars and Sixty Seven Cents. Witness the following signatures and Seal.
