This agreement of Bargain and Sale Made this Seventh day of December in the  
year 1867, between Martha B. Rockwell, James H. Rockwell, James R. Taylor, Mattie  
Taylor and William B. Shands grantors of the first part, and James Dillard, Warren Edwards,  
Jacob Denow and Thomas H. Cropp grantees of the other part, all of the County of Southampton  
and State of Virginia, Witnesseth that the said parties of the first part and in consideration  
of the sum of Sixteen hundred and fifty dollars (\$1650) by the parties of the second  
part to the parties of the first this day paid the receipts of which sum is hereby  
acknowledged do and each of them doth hereby bargain, sell grant and con-  
vey to the parties of the second part all the Log-pole and Oak timber of the  
of one foot in diameter and upwards at the roots or ground now standing  
in what is commonly known as the low grounds in the vicinity of the  
River on the East side thereof, it being the same which belong to the
