

This Deed Made this 10th day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and Sixty Seven between Samsen Whitfield (grantor) of the County of Southampton & State of Virginia of the first part and Richard L. Bryan's (Trustee) of the above named County and State of the second part. Whereby it is that the said Samsen Whitfield doth hereby grant and convey unto the said Richard L. Bryan's, the following property, to wit: One horse, (a Mare), 5 hogs together with their increase, Crops of Corn, fodder, Shooks, hay, peas, potatoes &c. One Car and 2 pair wheels & plows, hoes &c. Two beds & furniture, one Loom & gear, two Chests, Sideboard six chairs, two pots, one pan, one Spider, one Oven, one tea Kettle, 6 plates, 1 dish, 6 knives & 6 forks, 2 Axes, 3 Wood-hoes, 2 grub-hoes, 1 iron wedge &c. in kind, to Samsen the payment of the following debts namely: One debt due to Jorrell Arties for the Sum of One Hundred and forty one dollars and twenty Cents. dated the tenth day of December A.D. 1867, that is of the same date of this Deed. Whereas by a Decree of the Circuit Court of Southampton County pronounced on the 3rd day of May 1866, in a Cause caused therein pending wherein Norman &c., and others are the Plaintiffs and Wm. H. Langston, admr. of Elijah Jagers d.b. & others, are Defendants, it was decreed and ordered that Saml. Kello Sheriff of Southampton, proceed to sell before the Court House door of said County on some Court day, on a Credit of Twelve Months with interest from date, (except the Costs) after giving at least twenty days Notice of such Sale by advertisement at the Court House door of said County and at four other public places in said County, the Lands of which said Elijah Jagers doth possess & not thereto first sold, and among which is the following, to wit: A lot of Land as follows, containing about one half of an acre, and the said Saml. Kello, Sheriff as aforesaid was by said Decree directed to take him and good Security for the purchase Money, and to withhold the title to said Lands till the further order of the Court, and whereas in obedience to the said decree, the said Saml. Kello, as Sheriff, as aforesaid proceeded to advertise the said property in the manner directed, and did on the 17th day of September 1866 - being County Court day, before the Court House door of said County, sell at auction, on the terms aforesaid the said property above described, and at such Sale Joseph G. Kemmle became the highest bidder and purchased at the price of Sixty dollars, and of which he paid in Cash Three dollars and ten Cents and executed his Bond with good Security for \$50.90, the balance thereof. And whereas by a further Decree made in the said Cause on the 3rd day of May 1867, the said Saml. Kello, Sheriff
