Kello, Sheriff as aforesaid of the one part, and the said W^m H. Daughtry,
of the other part, witnesseth, that the said Sam'l. Kello, Sheriff as aforesaid
in Consideration of the sum of Eight hundred and Seventy eight Dollars and
Sixty Six Cents paid as aforesaid, and in execution of said last named
Deed, doth grant with special warranty unto the said W^m H. Daughtry,
and to his heirs and assigns forever, the Land sold & described as
aforesaid, with all the rights, privileges and appurtenances belonging to
