Darden his wife, of the first party, and Abraham Williams of the other party, Witness, that the said Samuel Darden & Sarah L. his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of five hundred and sixty dollars to the said Darden & wife, this day paid, the receipt of which sum is hereby acknowledged, do grant and convey to the said A. Williams, all that tract or parcel of Land, lying at "Pine Grove" in Southampton County, supposed to contain Eighteen and a half acres, more or less, and bounded as follows, to wit: On the North West, by the Road called the "Bones road" leading from the Pine Grove to Bone's Bridge, to Joseph B. Butler's line, thence from a point a corner tree, a straight line along said Butler's line to a Post Oak; thence along said Butler's line of marked trees to a Great Gum, thence along said Butler's line to a Second Gum, thence from said tree to the first road, to call it; thence up said first road parallel with the lot of said Abraham now stands the Methodist Church, called "Bones"; thence along the line of said Church Land around to the Road on the North side of said Church, thence up said road to the Conjunction of the first road with the aforesaid Bone's road.
