This Deed, made on the 21st day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and Sixty Seven, between Maj. James Dillard and Sarah Dillard his wife, on the first party, and Theo. G. Barthard, on the second, witnesseth, that in consideration of the sum of Two Thousand Dollars, which sum I hereby acknowledge the receipt of, the said Maj. James Dillard and Sarah Dillard his wife, do grant, bargain and sell unto the said Theo. G. Barthard, a certain tract or parcel of Land known as Marfa's Head, situated Env. 13th in the County of Southampton bounded as follows, viz: Commencing at the sign post on the South 1870-Quay Road and running wrd a line drawn in the center of said road opposite a certain cedar tree now standing on the side of said road about half the distance from the sign post above mentioned to Alfred C. Gott's said line, to continue along the center of said road with a prolongation of said straight line in a Northerly direction until it reaches the bank of the R. B. Daugherty, wrd near the Seaboard & R.R. Then running in a Northerly direction with the line of said Daugherty's Land and near the said Road as far as the Rudy Creek Branch, and down said branch to the cedar swamp and from thence down said swamp as far as the Jerusalem Road, and along said Road until it reached the sign post from whence the line runs in a Northerly direction as above stated. This Deed is intended to include all the houses on the land hereby conveyed with the following exceptions, viz: The p^o of a certain Barn, and one frame house with a brick Chimney, situated on the land running towards the cedar swamp, and one Smithhouse.
