I now all know, by these presents, that J. W. Vreghart, of Southampton County, Virginia, has made Constitution & appointed & do by these presents, make Constitution and appoint for J. W. Vreghart, of said County & State, my true & lawful attorney, for me & in my name, to act, demand, sue for, recover and receive, of and from all & every person or persons whatsoever, all & every sum or sums of money due & owing, or that may become due & owing to me and my account, whether due or to become due or payable on bill, bond, Note, Open account, Will, Debt, or otherwise; to give receipts & acquittances for the same, or as his discretion to compound, compromise & agree for the same, & give discharge; also for me & in my name to sign any bond, obligation, contract or agreement, or other paper whatsoever, to draw and endorse promissory notes, & the same to renew from time to time, to draw upon any bank or banks, or any banker or bankers, or other individual or individuals, for any sum or sums of money that may be to my credit, or which I may be entitled to receive & the same to deposit in any other bank & again as his pleasure to draw the same from time to time as I myself might or could do; & also for me & in my name to sue any part or parts of my real or personal estate, which I am entitled to in my own right, or in common with others, or howsoever I may be entitled to the same, and to make all necessary suits, conveyances & appearances therefor.
