sition of the same in the States aforesaid, & that this power should be taken to understand  
in the most comprehensive sense. And I authorize my said attorney, one or more  
attorneys under him to substitute, & again at his pleasure revoke, hereby ratifying and  
confirming whatever my said attorney may lawfully do hereunder. In witness whereof,

his heirs & assigns forever, and I the said Richd. J. Clements do Covenant with the  
said Wm G. J. Clements to have & hold & perfectly right to Sell and Convey the Land  
above named to the said Wm G. J. Clements, his heirs & assigns as aforesaid,  
and that I will warranty & defend the same to the said Wm G. J. Clements,  
his heirs & assigns against the lawful claims and demands of all persons.
