

Whereas Joshua Fullow and Joseph G. Crumpler, by contract duly recorded, sold on the 25th day of September 1855 to Thomas J. Burley, a tract of Land in Southampton County, which to R. A. Pritchard they purchased of Carroll & Beau & Co. by Deed duly recorded, and which Land is known as "Littletonland", and contains by estimation Seven hundred acres more or less, and is bounded on the West by the Land of Thomas Crisp and Richard Baile; North and East by the Blackwater River, & South by the Land of Lawrence Gardner & others; and whereas there remains due by the said Thomas J. Burley, on account of the purchase money due of him to said Joshua Fullow and Joseph G. Crumpler the sum of Thirteen hundred & Sixty two dollars and fifty six cents, on this day (including Principal & Interest); and whereas the said sum has been due of said Thomas J. Burley and others to John Fullow for Five Thousand five hundred dollars, as will be seen by a Deed of Southampton County made on December 1st 1857, in the chancery cause wherein pending wherein Hamm J. Burley and others are Plaintiffs and Thomas J. Burley and others, are Defendants, and whereas by said Deed it is provided that the amount remaining unpaid on the said Land of Thomas J. Burley to the said Joshua Fullow and Joseph G. Crumpler shall be paid out of the proceeds of the sale to John Fullow, by Thomas J. Fullow, as the Commissioner therein named, and whereas the said Thomas J. Fullow, as Commissioner as aforesaid, as he is authorized by said Deed to do, has paid to the said Joshua Fullow and Joseph G. Crumpler the sum of Thirteen hundred and sixty two dollars & fifty six cents being the Balance due from on said Land & all interest thereon, this Deed is therefore made to the said John Fullow as authorized by said Deed. Now therefore this 20th day of December one thousand eight hundred & forty seven, between the said Joshua Fullow and his wife, and the said Joseph G. Crumpler and Elizabeth V. his wife of the true body to the said John Fullow, of the other party. Witnesseth that the said parties of the first part, in consideration of the said sum of Money paid them as aforesaid & as authorized by said Deed, do grant with general warranty unto the said John Fullow the said Land aforesaid, with all its appurtenances, and the parties of the first part do hereby covenant to execute all further appearance thereof keeping & witness the following Signatures and Seals.
