

This Deed made this 20<sup>th</sup> day of February A.D. 1868, between E. C. Mayot of the first part, and E. W. Mapenburg & John J. Friend, Trustees of the second part and Joseph H. Barkam of the third part, witnesseth, that the said E. C. Mayot doth grant and Convey to the said Trustees, the following property, to wit, One tract of Land lying in the County of Southampton containing about One hundred and twenty eight (1128) acres, formerly owned by George B. Clegg and which was Conveyed to the said Mayot by Deed from Ichabod Tullow and Anna E. his wife, dated April 21<sup>st</sup> 1860, now of record in the Clerk's Office of Southampton County, all of the said E. C. Mayot's interest in a tract of Land lying in the said County containing about Five hundred and Sixty (560) acres, Near Newson's Depot, bounded by the Rail Road, the Seats of James J. Dardan and others. It being the same Land which was divided to the said Mayot, by Geo. M. Neal's will, after the life Estate of his widow (Hannah) shall terminate, also two Waggon, two Carts, and wheels, one Ox Cart, & wheels, three new iron bush & Casters, four Holes, and still 3 fixtures, and one Cotton Gin & fixtures. In Trust, to secure the payment of a debt due of Interguiney of the County of Southampton County, obtained at the Jane Penn of Saltbury, in the year 1861, for the amount of Four Thousand and hundred and Seventy six dollars and fifty three cents. (\$4176.53 cents) the interest being add'd upto February 26<sup>th</sup> 1868, the said Mayot having paid (\$180.00) cents, the interest for one year on the said debt on this day. Thus leaving the sum of \$4176.53 cents before stated, still due and owing, and which said sum it is hereby intended to secure. And the said Joseph H. Barkam promises and agrees to grant to the said E. C. Mayot, delay and credit in the payment of the said sum of \$4176.53 cents, for the period of five years from this date. And the said E. C. Mayot, promises and agrees to pay to the said Joseph H. Barkam the whole of the interest on the said debt of \$4176.53 cents, annually as the same may fall due, and if the said interest should not be paid within thirty days after the expiration of any year, the said Barkam may order the said Trustees to make sale of so much of the said property herein Conveyed, as may be necessary to pay the interest aforesaid. But in the event of the death of the said Joseph H. Barkam, within the said five years, his personal representative may, at his discretion, foreclose this Deed, for the purpose of paying the said debt. And the said Barkam, promises and agrees to accept of any amount that may be tendered to him, by the said Mayot, in liquidation of the said debt, beyond the interest, at any time whenever the said interest aforesaid may be tendered, although before the expiration of the said five years.
