Bell doth grant and convey unto the said William W. Cotty, the tract of Land formerly belonging to the Estate of J. P. Butler decd. and which was conveyed by the Executors of the said J. P. Butler decd. to C. W. Nicholson by Deed bearing date the 20th of July 1803, and which was conveyed to the said Wm. A. Bell by the said C. W. Nicholson by deed bearing date on the same day, the said tract (containing Three Hundred and thirty and one half acres, and Tensoned as Batts Old place) and the said Wm. A. Bell doth warrant generally the said tract conveyed.
