County of Southampton in the State of Virginia, witnesseth they for and in Consideration of the sum of
one Thousand and Sixty dollars, (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged,) the said Williams A.
Bell doth grant and convey unto the said William W. Cottt, the tract of Land formerly
belonging to the Estate of C. Butts deceased, and which was Conveyed by the Executress of
the said J. T. Butler deceased to C. H. Nicholson by her bearing date the 30th of July
1863, and which was Conveyed to the said Wm. A. Bell by the said C. H. Nicholson
by Deed bearing date at the same day, the said tract containing Three Hundred
and thirty and one half acres, and bounded as "Butts old place" and the said
Wm. A. Bell with all and generally the Land hereby Conveyed, &c.
