This Deed made on the 4th day of April in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and forty seven, between Robert S. Barnes, Pastor S. Story and Sophronia A. Story, his wife, Lucy S. Barnes and Benjamin S. Barnes of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, and William H. B. Mahood and Mary S. Mahood his wife, of the City of Petersburg, all of the one part, and Oliver D. Fines of the said County of Southampton of the other part, Whereas, that the said Robert S. Barnes, Pastor S. Story, Sophronia A. his wife, Lucy S. Barnes, and Benjamin S. Barnes, William H. B. Mahood and Mary S. his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred and forty three dollars & 35 cts. to them in hand paid by the said Oliver D. Fines, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged; Have granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents do grant, bargain & sell unto him the said Oliver D. Fines, his heirs and assigns forever, all their respective rights, titles and interests in and to, one certain tract or parcel of Land, situate, lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and Parish of Saint Andrew, containing Eight Acres and half, more or less, be the same more or less; It being part of the land of said land which was assigned as dower to Annand M. Worrell widow of Richard E. Worrell and about the year 1836, the whole of which dower right was subsequently purchased by said Robert S. Barnes, part of the grantors, namely, Sophronia A. Story, Lucy S. Barnes, Benjamin S. Barnes and Mary S. Mahood, and purposed & a few simple titles to four fifths of one fourth part of the said tract of Land, which is bounded by the lands of said Oliver D. Fines, Harwood B. Fines and others, and by the road leading from Mount Street Church to Rogers' Store. To have and to hold, all the rights, titles, and interests of them the said Robert S. Barnes, Pastor S. Story, Sophronia A. his wife, Lucy S. Barnes, Benjamin S. Barnes, William H. B. Mahood and Mary S. his wife, in and to the above described tract or parcel of Land and its appurtenances, unto him the said Oliver D. Fines, his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Robert S. Barnes, Pastor S. Story, Sophronia A. his wife, Lucy S. Barnes, Benjamin S. Barnes, William H. B. Mahood and Mary S. his wife, for themselves, their heirs, Executors and administrators, do hereby Covenant and agree with the said Oliver D. Fines, his heirs, Executors, administrators and assigns, that they will by these presents, Warranty and forever defend all their said rights, titles, and interests in, and to the aforesaid tract or parcel of Land and its appurtenances, against the claims, or demands of it and every other person, or persons whatsoever.
