name is also signed to the aforesaid writing bearing date the day of _____
this day personally appeared before me, in my City aforesaid, and after having had
the above writing fully explained to her, and being examined by me privately and
apart from her husband, acknowledged the same to be her act and deed, and declared
that she had willingly executed the same and did not wish to retract, &c.

At a Court held for the County of Southampton on the 18th of March, 1868.
This Deed of Bargain and Sale, dated the 4th day of April, 1867, from Robert S. Barnes,
Lucy S. Barnes, Benj. S. Barnes & Wm. H. B. Malwood & wife, to Edwin R. Stuy, was
proved by the Oath of Edwin R. Stuy a Writup there to as to Lucy S. and Benj. S. Barnes,
a Sub Robert S. Barnes, one of the parties being dead, Thomas B. Worrell and Benj. C.
Worrell, being sworn, severally deposed and said, "They are well acquainted with the
hand writing of the said Robert S. Barnes, and truly believe that the name of the said
Robert S. Barnes, to the said Deed subscribed is in his own proper hand writing."
Whereupon it is ordered that the said Deed be recorded as to the said Robert S. Barnes.
And on the 19th day of March, 1868, the said Deed was proved by the Oath of Davis
Barrett, a Writup there to as to Lucy S. and Benj. S. Barnes, and together with the
Certificate there annexed for the acknowledgment of Wm. H. B. Malwood, and of the
private examination and acknowledgment of Mary S. Malwood, his wife, before
a Notary Public, admitted to receive Stamps of the National Revenue of the United States,
to the amount of Fifty Cents, being affixed thereto and duly cancelled.

Whereas by a Decree of the Circuit Court of Southampton County, made on the day of November, 1867, in
a Chancery Cause therein pending, between Annis S. Bortage, an Infant, being by Thomas J. Bortage
her next friend, and the said Thomas J. Bortage in his own right, and Harriette, and Thomas J. Bortage
and John H. Bortage, Infants and Defendants, it was decreed & ordered, "That the contract made by
Thomas J. Bortage to sell the said and premises referred to in the Bill to John Bortage, for Five thousand
five hundred dollars, is advantageous to the interests of all parties concerned, to be confirmed and
ratified, and that Thomas J. Bortage, Jr. (who is hereby appointed a Commissioner for that purpose)
Make to the said John Bortage, a Deed for the said tract of land, of its Special containing in the usual
form, (retaining a Lien on the said land for the deferred payments,) on the payment to him by
the said John Bortage, of the sum of Five thousand dollars in cash and exceeding his bid with good
Security for the sum of Thirty five hundred dollars with interest from date." And whereas the said
John Bortage has paid the said sum of Five thousand dollars, in cash, and executed his bid to the
said Commissioner for the sum of Thirty five hundred dollars, payable his wards after date with interest
from this day, with Thomas J. Bortage as his Security, through this Deed is now made.
This Deed therefore made this 15th day of November, One thousand Eight hundred and Sixty Seven
