Barratt all of their right, title and interest in a certain lot of Land lying on the North Side of the Seaboard and Roanoke Railroad, in the Village of Franklin Depot, and in the County and State aforesaid known as the "Altamara Hotel" lot, which the said Linn bought of James A. Bell, the said Linn warrants the title generally to the aforesaid Barratt, his heirs and assigns forever. Given Under our hands and Seals this day and date above written.
