

This Deed Made this the 20th day of April 1868, between Walter Myricke of the first part, and the County of Southampton of the second party, WITNESSETH, that for and in Consideration of the sum of two hundred and fifty Dollars, the receipt whereof from the Sheriff of Southampton County is hereby acknowledged, the said Walter Myricke, does hereby grant and Convey unto the County of Southampton the Ferry Situated at Monroe, and the franchises and privileges of the same, and a small parcel of Land of one or two acres adjoining with house on the same. And the said Walter Myricke, does hereby agree to warrant and defend the title to the same against the lawful claims of all persons whatsoever. In Witness whereof the said Walter Myricke has hereunto set his hand and seal the day and year above written.

Stetts, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the said John W. Gurley, and Anna E. Gurley, his wife, doth sell and Convey unto the said James E. Stetts, all that ground or acreage, or tract of Land in the County of Southampton, Virginia known as the "Old place", near the Burnside Tavern, containing Two Hundred and Sixty five acres, more or less, and bounded as follows, To wit, on the North by the Sides of Chas. F. Gough's, on the East by the Sides of Wm. N. Stetts, and Thomas Linneman, on the South by the Sides of John Stetts and Joseph H. Bartland and on the West by the Sides of Charles F. Gough's, it being the tract of Land given the said Anna E. Gurley by her Father last Will and Testament reciting - For a more full and thorough description of said Land referred can be had of Clerk's Office, in aforesaid County of Southampton.
