

This Deed Made this 11th day of May in the year 1868 between William M. Beal, the grantor of the one part and William M. Beal the trustee for the other part; Whereas, the grantor William M. Beal, doth grant unto the said William M. Beal, Trustee, the following property to wit; Two (2) horses, seven sheep, two swine and one cow; and all of my farming utensils of every description, my stock of seed is paid for the said land and grant, in trust, to secure the debt of and George E. Beal amounting to two hundred dollars or upwards. I do further grant unto the said William M. Beal, Trustee, for the benefit of said George E. Beal, all right & title to the said property and also convey all the above-said property to the said William M. Beal, Trustee, for the benefit of said George E. Beal; and afterwards required by the said George E. Beal, the said William M. Beal, Trustee, shall so good of being two deep plowed, and shall sell to the highest bidder for cash the above-said property for the benefit of the said George E. Beal.
